Purple Coneflower	<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>	2-4 ft.	Pink/Purple	June-August

Joe Pye Weed	<i>Eupatorium fistulosum</i>	4-10 ft.	Mauve	August-September

Blazing Star	<i>Liatris spicata</i>	2-3 ft.	Purple	July-August
Great Blue Lobelia	<i>Lobelia siphilitica</i>	2 ft.	Blue	August-September
Wild Bergamot	<i>Monarda fistulosa</i>	2 ft.	Lavender	July
Sundrops	<i>Oenothera tetragona</i>	2 ft.	Yellow	May
Beardtongue	<i>Penstemon smallii</i>	1 1/2 ft.	Pink	May
Black-eyed Susan	<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>	2 ft.	Yellow	July-August
